LITTLE LEIGH PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

Held in Little Leigh village hall on Tuesday 14 November 2023 at 7pm

1) Attendance

Councillors Ayre, King, Littler and McSweeney were present with PCSO Wiggins and a further PCSO. The Chairman welcomed 8 members of the public to the meeting and informed attendees that decent standards of behaviour were expected. Apologies were received from Cllrs Beecroft, Jones and Lawless and from Ward councillors Gibbon, Marshall and Wright.

2) Declarations of interest - As all the parish councillors lived in the village they all had personal interests. In addition Cllr Jones was a trustee of the Little Leigh Community Trust and Councillors Jones was also a trustee of the Village Hall Management Committee

3) Public submissions.

• The owner of GKB Farm and Stud addressed the Parish Council. CWAC Planning enforcement officers had visited the premises as a result of complaints but had found no reasons to take enforcement action. They had informed him that he could have a temporary static caravan on site while work was progressing on the barn. The owner was concerned that people were taking photographs of the property and flying drones overhead. The Parish Council did not condone this behaviour.

4) Minutes of September meeting

Resolution 1 14.11.2023 The minutes of the meeting held on 14 September 2023 were approved Proposed Cllr Ayre seconded Cllr Mc Sweeney voting unanimous

5) Clerk's report

- The hedge overgrowing the Runcorn Road pathway had been cut back.
- Several thousand bulbs had been planted on the Brakeley Lane/Shutley Lane Triangle
- Soot Hill had reopened
- Councillors and the Clerk had attended virtual meetings on tree planting, planning and budgeting.
- New CWAC Public Rights of Way officers were in post and had looked at 2 of the Little Leigh footpaths.
- The Grapevine newsletter was being resurrected. Anyone who could volunteer to distribute the newsletter should contact Cllr Jones.

6) Councillor/Officer protocol

Resolution 2 14.11.2023 Councillors agreed to adopt the Councillor/Officer protocol. Proposed Cllr King seconded Cllr Littler.

7) PCSO /police report

The PCSO had carried out speed monitoring on Ash House Lane and had visited properties to discuss residents' concerns. Safe locations to carry out the monitoring had to be identified and risk assessed. CWAC had advised that Speed Indicator devices were ineffective in the long term in rural areas. It

might be possible to park a speed monitoring van in a layby on Runcorn Road to monitor speeds on the A533.

The PCSO and Cllr Littler had discussed the school parking situation. School Junior Safety Officers would be deployed between 2.45 and 3.15pm.

8) Ward Councillor's report

- The white lines were to be remarked at the Smithy Lane Ash House Lane A533 junction. CWAC had performed a lighting assessment but had no funds to effect improvements at costs ranging from £600 to £70,000.

- Marbury 10-year plan for major/ other highways projects to help improve ward infrastructure submitted –We wait to see whether any projects will be included.

• Marbury - I application is over 4 years old in Wincham - cold cases

Highways

- General Road Repairs plenty of activity across the ward/this is driven by both the regular surveys and reports through the App (encourage residents to keep reporting)
- Soot Hill now open
- Grids and Gulley Maps available for reference and addition. PM to arrange to circulate Maps.
- Dutton / reviewing speed limit related to the sad death A533 Northwich Rd (reviewing 50mph)
- Barnton A533 looking at speed gun assessment training
- PCC funding for overall speed assessment cameras if evidence supports need

- Resilience Plans on any kind of risk including flooding in preparation

 warm hubs/ equipment no more free sandbags

9) Highways Survey 2023

Four councillors had surveyed all the roads and pavements in the parish.100 defects had been reported to Highways using the CWAC Report it app. Only 17 reports had been judged to meet the CWAC criteria. A further 6 reports had been made where the depth of the pothole had been measured to be at least 4cm or 2.5cm on pavements. It was thought that CWAC might be applying further criteria so Cllr McSweeney would write to them.

10) Abba Tribute Band 16 March

A deposit had been paid and tickets would be sold at a cost of £15 available from Cllr Littler.

11) Green Festival 2024

A planning meeting had been held and potential stall holders had been identified. School premises would be used. Councillors agreed on 27 April for the event.

12) D Day 80th anniversary event 6 June 2024

As the event fell on a Thursday night it was thought attendance might be poor. There were no D Day veterans or widows in the Parish. National events and TV coverage would be promoted instead of holding an event.
